### Instructions:

Complete one data sheet each time you fish for salmon and trout on Lake Michigan or Huron. Even if you do not catch any Chinooks or steelhead, the trip information at the top of each page must be filled out for every trip.

Species – Chinook (CHS), steelhead (STL), etc.
Total Length – Tip of snout to tip of tail
Fate – Kept (K) or Released (R)
Sex – Male (M) or Female (F), NA if unkown
AD Clip – Yes for fish with adipose fin clipped
Other Marks – Record code for each fin and maxilla clipped on steelhead.

Depth – Can record depth of fish followed by depth of water, separated by slash (50/120)
Location – Record if fish was caught in a river mouth area, or in a river but leave blank if the fish was caught in big lake.



## **Codes for Fin Clips and Other Marks**



NO — No Clips
Multiple fin clips are possible, with ADLY, ADRP, ADLY, ADRV, ADLM, and ADRM most common in steelhead.

NOTE: If you enter 2 or more anglers, you must include data on all steelhead caught by other members of your group.
